PCMSC Hikes October 2013



Saturday, October 5. Part 2 of the Brighton Rim strenuous hike. This section starts at the Visitors Center in Brighton near Silver Lake. We will proceed with the pleasant hike to Twin Lakes Reservoir, then up the big rock pile to the top of Millicent. There is a slight descent before going up Wolverine, then down and up Tuscarora. From there we descend to Catherine pass and down the well-worn trail to Brighton. This will be about five to six miles, 2600 feet and will require about five hours. Anticipate rock hopping and some scrambling. We start in Brighton at 9:30 AM. There will not be a defined trail in some locations. The views from Millicent should be worth the walk. Meet informally at Park City Bread & Bagel, 3126 Quarry Road, Jeremy Ranch exit at 8:45 AM to carpool to the trailhead where the leader will meet you at 9:30 AM. Dogs are not permitted in this canyon. Bring a lunch and the six essentials. If there is snow on the mountain tops we will do something else. Dress appropriately for the weather. Call leader, David Anderson for more information (801.599.0618 or danderson@dcalaw.org).

Saturday, October 5, Bub Carlson will lead moderate hike up the Morman Trail and will add some historical background. The hike, along a creek, beaver ponds, and historical sites, will take about 4 hours, has a 1000 ft vertical, and is 7 miles (last mile is the steepest and optional). Dogs are invited. Bring a lunch. Meet at 9:30 at Park City Bagel/Pinebrook. Bub's number is [435-658-4728](tel:435-658-4728).

Sunday, October 13. Kitty Imdahl will lead an easy hike up the front or West side of Lost Prospector. This hike is so beautiful it may replace the Deer Valley to Park City as my favorite. When researching it on the Internet, several people said it is the most beautiful hike in Utah. It is up and back. I hope Mother Nature doesn't pop all the colors on trees too early. It is a beautiful hike with Fall Colors. Don't forget to bring your cameras and you can bring your dog too. You will have great views of all of Old Town Park City. You can see views of the Canyons and Deer Valley in the distance. We will view all of Prospector, Park Meadows, and down towards the hospital as we head east. This is a good hike for anyone recovering from injuries as you could go as far as you want before retracing steps. Meet at the Wasatch Bagels at 9:00am and we will need to carpool to the trailhead. Come earlier to share coffee & bagels. There are two very small parking spots on the right side of Aerie Drive with 3 spaces in the first and 4 in the second. There is a possibility of a few cars parking along the right curb going up Aerie Dr. We will hike out for about an hour and then back. Review Six Hiking Essentials and bring plenty of water. Saturday, October 19. Chuck Mollard will lead moderate from Rob's Trail parking lot, which is on the left hand side of Bear Hollow Drive, about 1.4 miles from the traffic light. Meet at 9:30 at trail head. This is a moderate loop hike up Rob's Trail to Rosebud's Heaven to Ambush, back to Rob's Trail, and return to the parking area. Total distance is 6.5 miles with 1400 elevation gain, and will take about 3 hours, not counting lunch break, so bring a lunch! Chuck's number is [917-881-9022](tel:917-881-9022)

Sunday, October 27. Annemarie Ferrari will lead moderate hike at Glenwilde. Elevation gain about 1000, hike about 2 1/2 hours. Vistas sweep across the Swaner nature Preserve plus mountains. Meet at Petco at Kimball Jct at 9:30. Bring a snack. Dogs are welcome. Annemarie's cell is [801-706-5117](tel:801-706-5117).

CYCLING NEWS

The middle of October will be the end the PCMSC Cycling program for 2013. Since the official start of the program in June, there have been over fifty road cycling rides led by various Club members. In addition, there were seven mountain bike rides scheduled. On behalf of PCMSC, we thank those that led rides and those that just participated. It takes all of you to have a successful program. This year, there has not been much interest in mountain bike riding and there have been very few participants. The club may wish to discontinue the mountain biking rides for the 2014 season, unless there is more specific interest shown for these rides.



Over twenty club members cycled in the National Abilities Center's "Summit Challenge" in August. There were a total of 620 cyclists participating in this ride, including 70 riders with disabilities. There were over 200 more riders this year than participated in the previous year.

SCHEDULED RIDES FOR OCTOBER

Week of September 28 – October 4

B-ride – Sept. 28 at 9:30 – Leader Bob Johnson – cell 908-310-3824

Meet in downtown Coalville near the Court House on Main St. This ride will be out to East Canyon Reservoir and back riding through Echo, Henefer and out RT 65 to East Canyon. This is a 40 mile ride with rolling hills and no big climbs.

C-ride – Sept. 28 at 9:30 – Leader Robin Reade – cell 860-989-1519

Meet in downtown Coalville near the Court House on Main St. This ride will be a loop on the back roads from Coalville to Wanship and back approximately 20 miles.

Week of October 5-11

B-ride – October 6 at 9:30 – Leader Paul Pietras – cell 561-350-9750

Meet at Basin Recreation parking lot. 24 miles with 1525 feet vertical climbing. Old Ranch Road loop to PCMR and return through Park Meadows back to Basin Recreation. Steepest climbs on Aspen Springs Road and Meadows Drive.

C-ride – October 6 at 9:30 - Leader Lita Hoffmann – cell 415-595-8880

Meet in front of the Midway City Community Center, 160 W. Main Street in Midway. This will be a Heber Valley Loop. This 16-mile ride loops through Midway, Heber City, Daniel, and Charleston. It is relatively flat with a few gradual ascents and descents.

C-ride - October 8 at 9:30 - Leader Annemarie Ferrari - Cell number 801-466-1972

Meet at the Petco parking lot at Kimball Junction. This will be an out and back ride of about 13 miles along the bike trail from Kimball Junction to Park City. There is a slight elevation gain. Only hybrid and Mountain bikes are suitable for this ride.

Week of October 12-18

All three rides will be on Saturday, October 12 to avoid any conflict with the hiking program. As noted below, there is a staggered start so that everyone will finish their ride at about the same time so they can attend the potluck lunch that will begin around 12:30 - 1:00 PM at the home of Chuck & Paddy Mollard. All rides will start from the Park City Community Church which is just down the street from the Mollard's house which located at 2100 Bear Hollow Drive.

A-ride – October 12 at 10:00 – Leader Bob Johnson - cell 908-310-3824

Meet at Park City Community Church. We will ride an extended version of the Park City loop that will include a loop up to Parley's Summit via Parley's Lane. Ride will be approximately 40 miles at an easy "A" pace.

B-ride – October 12 at 10:30 – Leader Karen Halverson – cell 314-304-4007\

Meet at Park City Community Church. This ride will be a 22 miles loop, down Old Ranch to Trailside to Silver Summit, to Old Highway 40. Then take a left onto Highway 248 and ride to "Hideout", where we will turn around and go back up the long hill on 248, to the lumber yard, "Stock Building Supply". We will turn left onto Jordanelle Parkway and then right onto Richardson Flat and return to the Community Church.

C-ride – October 12 at 10:30 – Leader Chuck Mollard – cell 917-881-9022

Meet at Park City Community Church. This will be a Park City loop similar to the ride featured as the 18 mile ride for the NAC "Summit Challenge". This will be Old Ranch Road to Trailside to Silver Summit Parkway to Old Route 40 to 248 and then bike path and local streets to avoid most of 248 and 224.

Tentative PCMSC Ski Schedule for 2013-2014

GROUP MEETING INFORMATION: We will always begin skiing at 10:00 am SHARP (except Tues & Thurs at PCMR) so make sure you have gone to the restroom in advance; it is not reasonable to expect a group to wait in the cold for anyone who is not prompt! These are our standard meeting locations: DV-the "beach" at Silver Lake in between the restaurant and Sterling lift; PCMR-top of Bonanza lift next to the demo shack; Canyons-inside Red Pine lodge at the top of the gondola; Brighton--base of Crest lift (earlier on powder days); Alta--base of Collins lift (above Goldminer's Daughter); Snowbird--on the plaza near the ticket windows. Most of these locations are one or two lifts up in the ski areas, so make sure you allow yourself plenty of time to get to the meeting places after you arrive at the ski areas.

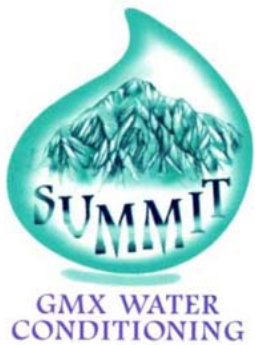

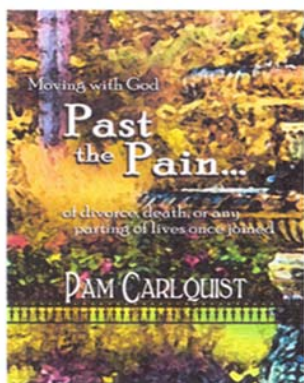
