It is time to scour your closets, costume store or wherever you hide your scary fashions.

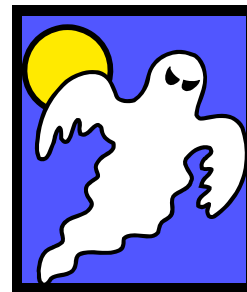
Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes: scariest, most original, most colorful, etc.

Synopsis of Minutes of the Board of Directors Meeting – September 2, 2014

The PCMSC Board meeting was called to order at 6:45 pm by Vice President Rob Brooke, a quorum was present and minutes of the August 2014 meeting were approved.

Sheree Anshel was introduced as the new Secretary for the Board. Sheree is replacing former secretary Becky Hinton. Sheree comes from Dallas, Texas. She has a background in international healthcare business development, critical and Palliative Care nursing. She continues to work part-time in oncological clinical research trials.

The Board wishes for members to be aware the last printed version of the club newsletter will be in October 2014. Beginning November 2014, all PCMSC information will be available on the website.

Stan Hooley reported the club is on budget. Peggy Hanson has found a storage unit near Home Depot and Board approved financing of storage lease and the cost of providing shelving in the unit. Peggy reported current membership is nearly 500 members. Membership renewals are on November 1, 2014 and fee is \$25 per person. The Board approved Sylvia Bennion's draft of a one-page flyer, which can be distributed to the Chamber, shops and other local venues to advertise the club.

Paddy Mollard reported on the fast approaching social events. The Halloween party will be held on October 31 at 6:00pm at the Sun Peak Club. There will be no charge for the party. Food is to be provided by all members as a Potluck dinner. All members are to bring their own alcohol or other drinks. The club will not be providing any food or drink. 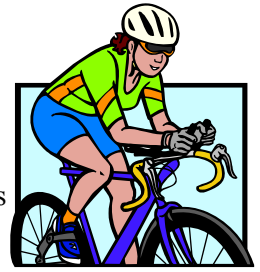
Saturday, Oct 18: Olympic Park Hike. Kathy Becker will lead a moderate hike on Olympic Park trails. Meet at 10:30 at the small parking lot on the west side (right side) of Olympic Pkwy, about half way up to the ski jump areas and building. Begin hiking on lower trails by the parking lot, then cross street to pick up Iron Bill Trail, then onto the Legacy Loop & Legacy Ridge trails. It is a gradual climb to the area above the ski jump hill. This will take about 2 hours, out & back. Kathy's # 435-714-9578

Sunday, Oct 26: DV Gondola to Snow Park Lodge & back. Mike Cohen will lead a moderate hike from the DV Gondola along Village Trail, to Deer Crest, to Pipeline, to Little Stick, to Finns, to Snowpark & back. Stop at Snowpark for snack. Not a lot of vertical. No dogs on this hike. Will take about 3 hours total. Meet at Quinns Jct Dog park at 9:45 to carpool to Gondola, or meet at 10 at Gondola.

CYCLING NEWS FOR OCTOBER

As the PCMSC organized cycling season is coming to a close, Bob and Chuck would like to thank the members for their participation and especially thank the persons that have volunteered to lead rides. Counting the rides scheduled for October there will have been 73 A,B,C road bike rides and 10 mountain bike rides. The overall participation, especially for the mountain bike rides has increased dramatically. However, the number of leaders has been just 32 members, which means that a lot of the leaders took these positions several times during the season. We would hope, now that more members are familiar with the bike routes they will volunteer to lead some rides next year. There were 23 members who signed up for the NAC Summit Challenge. While the weather was less than ideal, a majority of those that signed up actually rode that day.



The last organized rides will be held on October 11. With the mornings getting colder in October, we will start the rides a little later with 10:00 and 10:30 starts.

If the temperature is below 50 F at 9:30 AM on the day of the ride, it is automatically cancelled.

Week of October 4 - 10

Sunday, October 5 – B-Ride. Leader: Howard Kantor – Cell: 413-695-0277

Meet at 10:00 at the Midway City Park at the corner of Johnson Mill Rd/West Midway Ln. (Bathroom available). (Take HWY 40 to 100 South/UT 113, turn right and travel 2.2 miles. On your right, as you enter Midway, there is a triangular shaped park.)

The ride will be approximately 25 miles through Midway and Heber with gradual climbs and riding through mostly agricultural landscapes.

Sunday, October 5 – C-Ride. Leader: Denny Saturnino – Cell: 435-659-1666

Meet at 10:30 AM at Midway City Park at the corner of Johnson Mill Rd/West Midway Ln. (Bathroom available). (Take HWY 40 to 100 South/UT 113, turn right and travel 2.2 miles. On your right, as you enter Midway, there is a triangular shaped park.)

This will be a ride of 21 to 23 miles with a few climbs through Midway and Heber with mostly flat terrain.

If people from either the B or C ride would like to eat lunch after the ride, there is good Mexican food close to the start/finish.

Tuesday, October 7 – A-Ride. Leader: Paul Pietras – Cell: 561-350-9750

Meet at 10:00 AM at Basin Recreation Parking lot on Ute Blvd.

This will be a 42 mile loop around Park City with a climb up to Olympic Park, down through Bear Hollow and the Cove, make the right turn on Meadows Drive to Aspen Springs Drive, down on Iron Mountain Drive to Thaynes Canyon Drive and Three Kings Drive by the Park City Golf Course, climb Lowell Avenue by PCMR down Empire Drive back by the Golf Course again to Pay Day Drive over to 224. Take 224 to Old Ranch Road to Trail Side, go by Home Depot to Richardson Flats then down Kearns. Right on Monitor into Park Meadows where we do the climb up Meadows Drive down to 224 and return. There will be lots of climbing.

Week of October 11-17

Saturday, October 11 – A-Ride. Leader: Ben Koerselman – Cell: 435-333-2040

Meet at 9:30 at the Quarry Junction parking lot in front of Park City Bagels to car pool to the valley, (Wasatch Blvd.).

The ride goes down Wasatch Blvd toward the Cottonwoods and beyond. Details are sketchy, so the riders will just have to trust ole' Ben!! He advises the ride is "not too tough".

After the ride those who wish can do lunch.

Saturday, October 11 – B-Ride. Leader: Bill Benz – Cell: 801-859-5662

Meet at 10:30 at the intersection of SR-35 and E. Bench Creek Road in the community of Woodland in the Kamas city area. We can all park in the LDS Church parking lot on the SE corner of that intersection. The address is 4219 S. Bench Creek Rd, Kamas (Woodland), UT 84036.

This will be a 27 mile out and back ride along Bench Creek and then the South Fork of the Provo River, and will pass by the Nobletts trailhead along the way. Since we will be riding in October, the Fall colors all around us should be spectacular, and the road we will be riding on is smooth and should be relatively free from traffic. This is a beautiful ride that winds through beautiful farmland, some very nice homes, a bison ranch, and some very scenic views of large aspen groves and pine forests.

The ride will start a 6800 feet elevation and make a gradual climb to about 7,800 meet. Then there is an optional steeper climb of 600 feet elevation to reach the turn-around point at Memorial Monument. However, anyone not wishing to make this stepper climb can wait for the group to return from the top.

Being this is late in the season and you B-riders are in good shape, this ride is doable for all B-riders.

Meet at 10:30 in parking lot in front of Storm Cycle in Kimball Junction

This will be an 18 mile loop around Park City – Highland Drive to Trailside to bike path past the hospital, bike path along 248 to bike path alongside 224 to Old Ranch Road back to Highland and parking lot.

For all that are interested, we shall go to lunch in Kimball Junction to celebrate the end of the organized biking season.

Location is Deer Valley's Silver Lake Lodge.

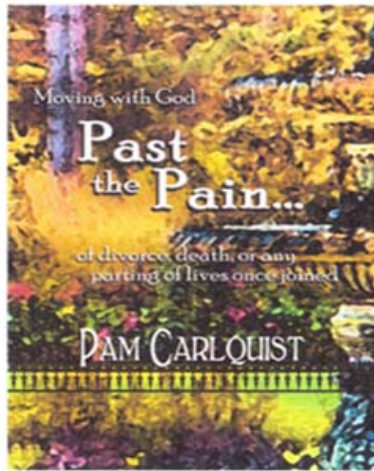
